1. Scottish Bible Society

https://www.scottishbiblesociety.org/resources/schools This has great resources for schools – videos, lessonplans and storytrail ideas for '10 Bible stories' All are free and well produced for younger and older primary pupils. The stories covered are Creation, Noah's Ark, Christmas, Easter, David and Goliath, the 10 Commandments, Daniel and the Lions, Prodigal Son, Feeding of the 5000, and the Good Samaritan. Well worth exploring.

3. Truetube website

TrueTube: www.truetube.co.uk

This is most useful for teaching about world religions. Very good insider stories and engaging for pupils. Some of the stories are bbc and not accessible in Ireland. There are lots of resources for all ages – here are a few I use.

- 1. Search for Charlie and Blue in the search bar for 7 videos introducing different world faiths. I think the Christianity one is the weakest. One interesting one is the video about beliefs about the soul introducing no religious faith to the younger pupils (soul searching). Pitched at Infants-2nd class (Blue is a puppet)
- 2. Search for Alien Abduction in the search bar and these are directed at 5th/6th class. The character has to answer questions about their faith. Great for projects.
- 3. Search for Holy Cribs and there are 9 insider videos for places of worship. These have just been updated. Again for the older pupil and there are downloadable resources.

4. Museum of the Bible (Washington)

This set of Bible stories are told by storytellers and are very clever. (Some are better than others!!).

5. New Zealand Bible Stories Website

This is a New Zealand RE resource site. It is quite hard to navigate but worth while if you are looking for Big book or printable versions of almost every possible Bible story in cartoon version to be read to Infants -2^{nd} class. Each story is available in many different formats: narrated, flip book, video telling, printable booklet, big book, all on one page etc.

6. The Chester Beatty Library (Dublin)

Chester Beatty Library https://chesterbeatty.ie/ Show pupils images of early scrolls or codexes. Look at icons or art from other religions. Download the Chester Beatty app from app stores on apple or android and pupils can explore the art on ipads. Great for enquiry based learning on bible history/ documents and religious art and collection from world religions.

7. Online virtual tours of places of worship

Brings the culture and religion into view. There's more than religious sites and buildings on the website.

The Exploring our world and Exploring why books are on line and really suitable for younger children – they explore different faiths from the perspective of children – celebrations, food etc. and would tie in well to Aistear themes. I like the Randalph books – again online as they are for slightly older children and could so easily be related to Ireland and special places we have. They have a separate website: https://randalphthewise.com/. The other useful resource on this site is

the World Faith's series with teacher's manuals and pupils' resources for each of the main world faiths.
